Job Announcement: 2024 Young Musicians Program Staff Member

The Walden School seeks interested candidates who wish to participate as staff members in its flagship Young Musicians Program in Dublin, New Hampshire, during the summer of 2024.

Staff members perform a variety of operational and supervisory tasks to ensure the efficient running of our unique summer music camp and a nurturing, safe, and inclusive environment for its community members. Staff members' individual roles and responsibilities vary from day to day, but often include a combination of administrative work, leading student recreation activities, and providing operational support for the school's activities, including but not limited to moving furniture, making beds, running errands in local towns, doing laundry, setting up classrooms, distributing mail, and lifting/carrying boxes and shipments. Events and activities during the program are varied and numerous, including hikes, swim trips, dances, concerts, shopping trips, and open mics, just to name a few. Engaged supervision of students in all these activities is a major aspect of the staff role, as are residential duties including bed checks and leading dorm meetings. Additionally, staff participate in the school's choral program, and occasionally provide tutoring and mentoring to young musicians (ages 9-18) engaging in a wide range of musical practices.

Staff members certified in water safety and lifeguarding who, in addition to the above duties, are hired to perform lifeguarding duties on lake trips, will receive a \$500 stipend for this work in addition to the regular staff salary.

Individuals who thrive as staff members at The Walden School are energetic, flexible, collaborative, thrive in a fast-paced and dynamic environment, enjoy working with young people and adults alike, are both self-motivated and able to take direction, and have a sense of humor. The Walden School values creativity and community, and we invite individuals to apply who are seeking a challenging and rewarding opportunity, who can support our mission of inspiring creativity in students, and who can lead capably in a diverse community setting. The Director of Operations, the Assistant Director of Operations, and the Director of the Young Musicians Program jointly supervise staff members.

Staff members must be available at least 6 days prior to the start of the session (arrival no later than Sunday, June 23) through Friday, August 9, 2023 (departure). Compensation is in the form of salary, as well as room (single room, shared bathroom with students and other faculty/staff) and board. Lifeguarding-certified staff members who are hired to serve as lifeguards at YMP will receive a \$500 stipend in addition to salary, room, and board. Candidates must have a high school diploma or GED/equivalent, must have completed high school, at a minimum, one calendar year prior to the start of the Young Musicians Program, and cannot have been a student at the Young Musicians Program during the summer of 2023.

Preference may be given to:

- Applicants with experience working as a mentor or counselor for school-age children
- Applicants whose work experience demonstrates an aptitude for flexibility and teamwork
- Applicants who have experience in a wide range of musical topics or musical styles.
- Applicants with experience in customer service or administrative work
- Applicants who have a valid driver's license and, if over the age of 21, are willing to drive a 15-passenger vehicle
- Applicants who are certified in water safety and lifeguarding or are interested in and capable of obtaining such certification prior to employment
- And/or candidates who will welcome the opportunity to perform some childcare duties for faculty & administration children as part of their duties.

Staff members must be certified in first aid and CPR (valid at least through August 4, 2024). You do not need these certifications to apply, and must be willing to gain these certifications in advance of June 29 to work at YMP.

Staff members must be able to lift and move packages and boxes up to 25lbs in weight.

Review of applications will begin February 1, 2024, and positions will be open until filled.
